A live 38" Ponderosa Pine with a previously opened blaze with scribes visible, bears S77°E, 411.2 I nail a "Bearing Tree" sign above the blaze

A sawn and decayed Ponderosa Pine stump, no marks remaining, bears N51°E, 135.3 feet

Monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original position of this corner:

I build a mound of stones around the pipe, from which: ground. A 2 1/2" brass cap attached to the pipe is marked as shown in the diagram above At record distance from the bearing tree evidence, I set a 1" x 30" galvanized iron pipe 24" into the

A 7" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "T4S BT" on double blazes, bears S34°W, 140.8 feet. A 17" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "1/4 S36 BT" on double blazes, bears N20°W, 57.1 feet. A 15" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "1/4 S36 BT" on double blazes, bears N24°E, 98.0 feet

The new bearing trees each have a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636", nailed flush to the
