

A black pine 8 in dia bears N.65°W 35 lks dist. marked 1/4S.B.T.

A black pine 9 in dia bears S.70°E 26 lks dist. marked 1/4S.B.T.

1938 GLO DESCRIPTION: Proportionate measurement, Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd. (diagram shown) from which

A tamarack, 18 ins. diam., bears N.55°E., 25 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S 16 B T.

A tamarack, 12 ins. diam., bears S.18°W., 48 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S 17 B T.

UPTON'S DESCRIPTION: 1 inch iron pipe, with 2 1/2 inch brass cap marked as shown above, from which---

20" Tamarack, dead and down, bears easterly 20', scribing 1/4 S 16 BT legible.

No evidence of original Bearing Tree for Section 17 found.

From Corner location as found and described above,

New Bearing Tree, 11" White Fir, bears N 42° E a distance of 26.3 feet, which I marked "1/4 S 16 BT".

New Bearing Tree, 11" White Fir, bears N 82° W a distance of 12.6 feet, which I marked 1/4 S 17 BT.

EVIDENCE FOUND: Found 1" iron pipe with attached 2½" GLO brass cap (marked as shown below), projecting 10" above ground with no visible mound of stone. From which:

- ► A white fir snag, 7 feet tall, bears N.82°W., 12.6 ft. with scribing "1/4 S17 BT" visible in upper blaze and scribing "BT" visible in lower blaze
- ▶ No remains of Upton's NE bearing tree could be found, as the position falls in a skid trail

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED:


I accept the found brass-capped monument for the true corner position.

I SET THE FOLLOWING REFERENCE POINTS:

- ► A 5/8"x30" iron pin driven flush with the ground bears N.66°E., 15.03 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked "RP 1 2021 PLS 69454"
- ► A 5/8"x30" iron pin driven flush with the ground bears S.54°E., 16.70 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked "RP 2 2021 PLS 69454"
- ► A 5/8"x30" iron pin driven flush with the ground bears S.43°W., 16.85 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked "RP 3 2021 PLS 69454"
- ► A 5/8"x30" iron pin driven flush with the ground bears N.42°W., 22.1 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked "RP 4 2021 PLS 69454"

Painted a 6 inch red band around the found bearing tree, and also painted the blazes red, and attached USFS signs 54-3 and 54-9. Distances to accessories measured with a steel tape. Bearings were measured with a magnetic compass with 14° East declination.
