
# **RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION**

CENTER-EAST 1/16 CORNER SECTION 21, T. 5 S., R. 28 E., W.M.

ORIGINALLY ESTABLISHED BY: Thomas F. Upton, PLS 1024

COUNTY SURVEYOR DOCUMENTATION: Map of Survey recorded 1/12/82 as C-460-K-465 and associated monumentation record filed 1/12/82



**ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION:** At the location of this corner, as established by a survey conducted by me, set a 2 1/2 inch alum. pipe, 30 inches long, 2 feet in the ground, with an alum. cap marked as shown above.

From the monument as set,

A Bearing Tree, an 11" White Fir, bears N 29° E, a distance of 22.4 feet, which I marked CE 1/16 S21 BT A Bearing Tree, an 11" White Fir, bears S 5° W a distance of 22.4 feet, which I marked CE 1/16 S21 BT

EVIDENCE FOUND: Found a  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum pipe with  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " aluminum cap projecting 4" above ground with no visible mound of stone. From which, I found the following bearing trees:

- ▶ A white fir, dead and down, bears N.29°E. with scribing visible in an open double blaze
- ▶ A white fir stump, cut 6 ft. high, bears S.5°W., 22.4 ft. with scribing visible in an open double blaze

#### DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED:

I accept the found aluminum monument for the true corner position.

### From which, I SCRIBE THE FOLLOWING NEW BEARING TREE:


► A western larch, 10" dbh bears S39°E., 20.64 ft. marked "CE1/16 S21" in upper blaze, and "BT" in lower blaze

## I also SET THE FOLLOWING REFERENCE POINT:

► A 5/8"x30" iron pin driven flush with the ground bears N.66°E., 5.73 ft., with attached 2" aluminum cap marked "RP 1 2021 PLS 69454"

Painted a 6 inch red band around the bearing trees, and also painted the blazes red, and attached USFS signs 54-3 and 54-9. Distances measured with a steel tape. Distance to new bearing tree was measured to a 60d nail driven in the side-center-right at the root crown of the tree. Bearings were measured with a magnetic compass with 14° East declination.
