ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION: Set stone 18x18x8, in stone mound for \(\frac{1}{4} \) sec cor

WELLS 1979 DESCRIPTION: Found 18"x18"x8" stone lying on top of flat stone mound. Also found a larger stone mound 12.0 feet north of the accepted $\frac{1}{4}$ corner. This mound did not contain any stone matching the size of the original stone set. The north line of section 26 was surveyed to verify the accepted $\frac{1}{4}$ corner position. The position of the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner stone accepted is $2.7 \pm \text{feet}$ north and $24.5 \pm \text{feet}$ east of the computed position.

At the corner position a 2 inch by 30 inch iron pipe, with brass cap marked as shown, was set 6 inches in the ground and surrounded with a mound of stones to the cap. Set steel fence posts north and west of corner on property line and attached signs 54-2 and 54-4.

Established 2 reference monuments, R.M.'s are 2"x30" iron pipes with brass caps set 6" in the ground and surrounded with mounds of stone to the cap.

MCKINNIS 2014 DESCRIPTION: Found Section Monument as Described. 3" Brass Cap, Quarter Corner, Sec. 23-26, 6S 26E, PLS 1106, 1979, C.S. #C-253-K

EVIDENCE FOUND: Found a 5 ft mound of stones approximately 6 ft south and 5 ft east of a fence corner, the monument was not recovered. Also found 2 reference monuments disturbed lying alongside 5 ft mounds of stone. Each mound of stone had a visible location in the approximate center that appeared to be the location of the monument. These locations were verified with a steel tape and all agreed with each other very well.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED:

At the corner point, I set a 5/8"x24" iron pin with attached 3¼" brass cap, in a drill hole 13" in bedrock. Raised a 4½ ft diameter mound of stone around the monument to the top of cap. Cap is marked as shown.

From which, WELLS REFERENCE MONUMENTS:

- ► A 2½"x30" iron pipe bears N 7½° E, 17.82 ft, with 3½" brass cap attached re-set 6" in the ground in center of a 4 ft mound of stone 24" high.
- A 2½"x30" iron pipe bears S 59½° E, 18.51 ft, with 3½" brass cap attached re-set 6" in the ground in center of a 4½ ft mound of stone 22" high.

Also from which, I SET NEW REFERENCE MONUMENTS:

- ► A 5/8"x 16" iron pin, driven 10" into a drill hole in bedrock, bears S 13° W., 38.19 ft, with attached 2" aluminum cap marked RM 1 2023 PLS 91693.
- A 5/8"x 16" iron pin, driven 9" into a drill hole in bedrock, bears S 66° W, 27.28 ft, with attached 2" aluminum cap marked RM 2 2023 PLS 91693.
