

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

J-9
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History of original corner establishment:
 Edward W. Sanderson subdivided T.6S., R.27E. under
 G.L.C. contract no. 358, dated Sep. 7, 1880. He set
 a stone, 14" x 12" x 7", in a stone mound from which:

A Pine, 28" dia., N62°W, 45 lbs.
 A Pine, 15" dia., N48°E, 42 lbs.
 A Pine, 20" dia., S64°E, 117 lbs.

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Description of corner evidence found:

I found a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " alum. pipe with a 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " alum. cap (BLM) mka.: 317|316
 From which:

A Ponderosa Pine, 11" dia., N31°E, 70.9 ft.; scribing visible.
 A Ponderosa Pine, 34" dia., S46°E, 77.2 ft.; scribing visible.
 A Ponderosa Pine, 13" dia., S35 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W, 37.7 ft.; scribing visible.
 A Ponderosa Pine, 42" dia., N62°W, 29.7 ft.;
 tree is dying; scribing visible.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

I marked a new BT:

A Ponderosa Pine, 14" dia., N77°W, 103.2 ft.; mkd.: T6S R27E S8 BT
 BTs have blaze and a 6" band painted red, BT tags and "Land Survey Monument" signs. New BT has, additionally, an alum. "PLS 1832" washer nailed to the bottom of the blaze. There is a 6" steel fence post with a "Land Survey Monument" sign within 5' of the corner.

Measured to center of BTs using steel tape and staff compass. Magnetic declination set at 200E.
