
## RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

SOUTH 1/4 CORNER SECTION 12, T. 6 S., R. 28 E., W.M.

ORIGINALLY ESTABLISHED BY: Edward W. Sanderson, U.S. Deputy Surveyor

ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION: Set stone 19x17x8 in stone mound for qur. sec. cor from which A fir 8 in dia. bears East 25 lks. dist

EVIDENCE FOUND: After a diligent search, we found no remaining evidence of the original corner.

A dead and down fir was found in the expected search position for the original bearing tree, which was cut into and thoroughly examined, but no evidence of a blaze or scribe was present. The search area showed signs of extensive logging activity and soil disturbance from heavy equipment. I declare this corner lost, and reestablish its position by single proportionate measurement between the reestablished southwest corner of Section 12 and the found southeast corner of Section 12.

## DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED:

At the corner point as determined by survey, I set a standard USFS  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x30" aluminum pipe with attached  $3\frac{1}{4}$ " aluminum cap, 28" in the ground. Raised a 2 ft. diameter mound of stone around monument to base of cap. Cap is marked as shown below.

## From which, I SCRIBE NEW BEARING TREES:

- ► A lodgepole pine 5" dbh bears N.47°E., 20.3 ft. marked X in upper blaze and BT in lower blaze
- ► A Douglas fir 21" dbh bears S.79°E., 24.0 ft. marked 1/4S13 in upper blaze and BT in lower blaze
- ► A Douglas fir 7" dbh bears S.55°W., 23.6 ft. marked 1/4S13 in upper blaze and BT in lower blaze
- ► A Douglas fir 23" dbh bears N.22°W., 10.8 ft. marked 1/4S12 in upper blaze and BT in lower blaze





Placed a plastic-encased magnet at the base of the pipe. Painted a 6 inch red band around each bearing tree, and also painted the blazes red. Attached USFS 54-3 and 54-9 signs to the bearing trees.

Distances to trees measured with a steel tape, measuring to a 60d nail driven in the right-side-center at the root crown of each tree, with an attached  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " brass washer stamped *PLS 69454*. Bearings to trees measured with a magnetic compass with  $14^\circ$  East declination.
